

Exploring Anchorage – Alaska Native Heritage Center – May 10th, 2009

Your day will be spent exploring Anchorage beginning with a 1-hour city tour and a stop at the Alaska Wildberry Products Factory. Watch candies, jams and jellies being made through 100 feet of viewing windows. Plus treat your taste buds to delicious chocolates and fudge in their unique full line candy store. Also experience the World's largest chocolate waterfall, over 20 feet of cascading chocolate. Afterwards you will tour the Alaska Native Heritage Center and come face-to-face with Alaska's first people and experience Alaska's Native cultures first-hand. This unique and personal cultural experience offers many opportunities to learn about Alaska's Native people in ways never before possible. The Alaska Native Heritage Center brings together Alaska's many distinct Native cultures: Athabascans from the interior; Yup'ik and Cup'ik from the west coast; Inupiaq and St. Lawrence Island Yupik of the north; Aleuts and Alutiiqs of the north Pacific; and Eyak, Tlingit, Haida and Tsimishian from the southeast. Each group utilizes the land's natural resources for food, clothing, shelter, tools and weapons in their own unique ways. The center features authentic village settings, cultural galleries for each Alaska Native group, demonstrating native artist and a 15-minute movie on Alaska's natives.
